



## Easy Star Purse

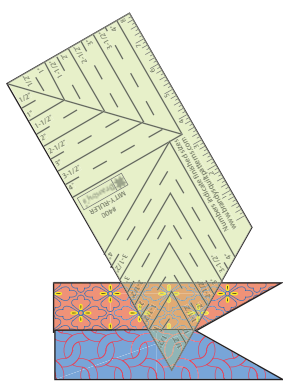
Peggy makes this great little purse from the leftover strips from her quilts.

### Sewing Supplies:

- Brandy's Mity Ruler
- Sulky 30 wt. Cotton thread
- Rotary Cutter and Mat
- Open Toe Foot #820215096
- Scraps of black print red print and blue print
- 6 1/2" x 44" strip of tone on tone white for purse.
- One yard cord for handle
- Sulky KK2000 Temporary Spray Adhesive

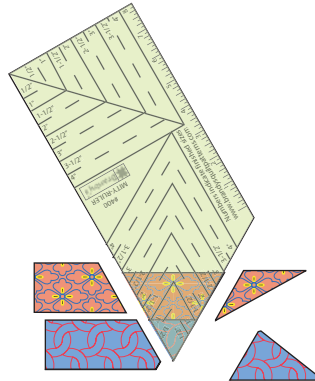
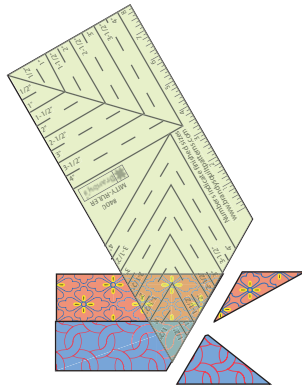


This method is based on your using scraps, left over from your strips that you sewed together for your quilt. If you don't have any leftover strips, piece together 2 1/4" wide strips before you begin.



1. Line up the 1" mark on each side of the seam line.

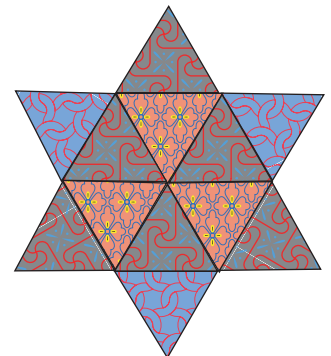
2. Cut one edge:



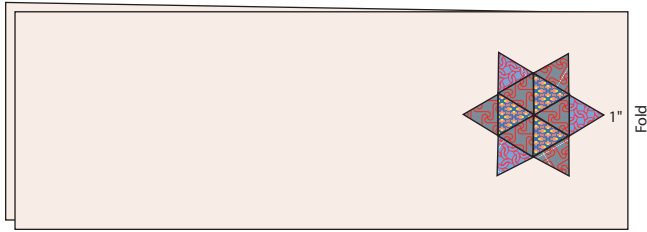
3. Turn, cut the other.

4. Repeat for the other side.

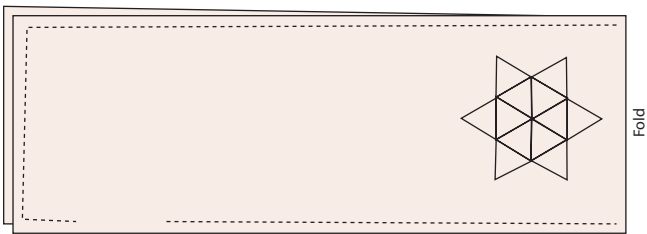
5. You need 6 diamonds all together. your star will look like this.



- Fold the strip of white in half. Place the star 1" from the fold, as shown.



- Open out the white strip so you are working with a single layer of fabric. Spray the pieces with KK2000 Temporary Spray Adhesive to hold them in place.
- Attach your 6mm Open Toe Foot and select a satin stitch. Thread with 30 wt. Cotton Thread on top and in the bobbin. Place Tear Easy Stabilizer under the star, and satin stitch around the star segments.
- Fold the fabric on the fold line, by the star, right sides together. Stitch on the three sides, leaving an opening for turning on a side, away from the star, as shown.



- Trim the corners, turn and press.
- Fold the purse in thirds. Insert the cord for the handle as shown, and topstitch.
- Topstitch each edge.

Your purse is done!
